litigation	<i>noun</i> - to cause (a case, an issue, etc.) to be decided and settled in a court of law	<i>Technology companies should have a good patent portfolio to protect them against possible litigation.</i>
qualms	<i>noun</i> - (a) feeling of doubt or uncertainty about whether one is doing the right thing	<i>After attaining a degree from a prestigious college, a student should not have any qualms about being able to find a good job after graduation.</i>
crippling	<i>adjective</i> - describing great damage to something, or something that is made unable to work normally	<i>If the government does not take appropriate and timely action, It can give the economy a crippling blow which can lead into a recession.</i>
